With hundreds of National Service airmen being in the RAF, representing one's station was quite competitive. Further, we Apps were not permitted to try out for the Station teams. There was one specific exception - Robin. He was an excellent and most dextrous hockey player, and represented the Station regularly. He also indulged, if not caught, in undercutting whereby the hockey ball became a dangerous missile! I should add that these practices were mixed sex, and I quickly realised that females were the most dangerous of the species! Robin represented the various Commands where he served, and he was also an excellent tennis player. CHAIRMAN'S SERVICE BRIEFING

DISBANDMENT OF NUMBER 617 SQN

No 617 (Dambuster) Sqn and the sister unit number 12 (Bomber) Squadron will disband at RAF Lossiemouth by 1 April 2014. The disbandment is part of the planned drawdown of the Tornado GR4 Force towards an out-of-service date in 2019. It is part of the wider change programme in the Royal Air Force's combat air forces that also sees the growth of the Typhoon Force and the introduction of the F35B Lightning II aircraft. The disbandment will make way for Typhoon aircraft which will begin relocating to Lossiemouth from RAF Leuchars in late 2013. The Squadron's rich history, which includes the 1943 Dams Raid and more recent operations in Iraq, Afghanistan and Libya, has led to a decision to re-form 617 Sqn, probably at RAF Marham, as the UK's first operational Lightning II Sqn, which will be jointly manned by the RN and RAF.

The Hercules C130K will be retired from service on 31 October 2013 and the capabilities and roles provided by the C130K aircraft will be transferred to the C130J variant. Whilst further extension of the C130K OSD has been considered, the decision to retire the variant was taken primarily for Air Safety reasons; in addition this decision will also allow best use of resource to develop the C130J capability.

ITEM 3 Minutes of the Fifteenth Annual General Meeting held on 16 June 2012.

A copy of the minutes was circulated with the August 2012 Newsletter and are therefore taken as read. Proposed; R Shepherd 23rd, Seconded D Davies 29th that the minutes be accepted as a true record. Carried.

ITEM 4 Matters arising from the AGM held on 16 June 2012 (Other than items on today's agenda)

There were no matters arising from the minutes that are not covered elsewhere in these minutes.

ITEM 5 Presentation, review and acceptance of the Association Accounts for the financial year ended 31 March 2013

The Treasurer had distributed copies of the audited Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet. These accounts have been audited by John Waltham and there were no formal comments from the Auditor. As was seen from the Income and Expenditure Account, the excess of income over expenditure has shown a decrease from £1,618.88 to £865.98. However, there was a payment of £500.00 for the 2014 AGM hotel deposit, which has been reserved in this year's account. On the income side: Subscriptions were down; Income from the sale of ties & badges was up overall; T-Plus commission has remained roughly the same as last year; Bank interest from the deposit account and High Interest Bond was down slightly. Since the end of the financial year the latest 6 month notice High Income Bond has

matured but has not been re-invested. A deposit of £10,000 has been made into the Cambridge & Counties Bank 95 day notice account which pays 1.95% compared with around 0.5% from the High Interest Bond. All donations made to the Association last year were initially paid into the NMA account; however all bills for the NMA memorial have now been paid. Since then any donations to the Association have been paid into the donations account amounting to £136.05 for the year. There were some major changes on the expenditure side, these were: A further reduction in the cost of telephone calls. The same for newsletter printing as more members receive their newsletter by e-mail. Also, donations to the RAF Ben Fund have fallen as not as many members have passed away. Travel costs have increased, due mainly to meetings for the NMA Project and some costs paid last year that were incurred in the previous year. There was a net cost of £170.00 from last year's Reunion due to the cost of the coach for the Ladies' trip. At this point last year we needed to find £1,400 to fully fund the NMA Project. Sufficient donations were received and all bills have been settled. Overall, the Association remains on a sound financial footing. There were again a number of late subscription payers resulting in 54 needing one reminder to pay (last year 71) and 27 needing 2 reminders to pay (last year 21). This resulted in a loss of 16 members who either resigned or whose membership has now lapsed (last year 23). There is no problem with members paying for more than one year at a time. Also, the Treasure had standing order mandates if anyone wanted one. Trevor Moore 14th proposed and Bob Mabbott 16th seconded that the accounts be accepted as audited. Unanimous

ITEM 6 Annual Membership fees for the year 2014

The Treasurer stated that the Association remains on a sound financial footing and there are no reasons to increase the current level of subscriptions at the moment. Proposed by Garry Hoyland 330th, seconded by John Waltham 19th that the annual subscription remains at £10.00. Unanimous.

ITEM 7 Reports for the period 1 June 2012 to 31 May 2013 from the following committee members.

a. Chairman

The Chairman thanked our President and the whole of the Committee for their support to him and their continuing dedication and hard work on behalf of the Association over the last year. Before starting the individual reports he invited our Association President, Jim Wilcox, to say a few words. The President then thanked Bryan for all his hard work in obtaining all the numbers/names of Administrative Apprentices. He also thanked all the Committee members for all their work.

The Chairman continued, the Association has a number of very well established Regional Groups; namely SW Herts, Gloucester, Cyprus, Spain and Dorset, all who meet on a regular basis and their reports are in the Newsletters and on the website pages. These Groups are now entirely self-sufficient and each has its own coordinator and he thanked them all for their work and continuing commitment to the Association. Again it was very disappointing to see so many former members failing to renew their subscription at the end of last year. Eight members resigned and a further 8 allowed their membership to lapse: Half of these lapsed members were from the 300 series entries. The future of our Association lies in the hands of the later entries and it would be a great pity if we continue to lose members at such a high rate.

Membership Secretary

The Membership Secretary stated that since the last AGM we had 13 new members join the Association. Unfortunately there have been 12 deaths in this period, also 8 resignations and 8 lapsed memberships. Total membership now stands at 593, comprising of 556 full members (13 of whom are ex-Ruislip), 1 Life member (Our President), 30 Honorary, 1 Affiliated, 3 Associate and 2 Friends of the Association.

c. <u>Newsletter Editor</u>

The Newsletter Editor stated that he had now received sufficient items for the newsletters but hopes that members will continue to provide items, anecdotes and continue with the reports of meetings, anniversaries etc, both to him and the Website Manager.

d. Social Secretary

The Social Secretary opened by thanking the Chairman for all his support in organising the Reunions. It has been proposed that we do not use Preston again as a Reunion venue; principally because of the distance and also it did not draw in many new faces. The 2014 AGM & reunion will be at the Marriott Hotel Peterborough over the weekend 13/14/15 June. Prices are held at the 2013 rate of £65 per person per night with a £15 single supplement. He has negotiated a discount of 35% on **all** bar prices over the weekend.

e. <u>Publicity Officer</u>

Bob Danes, The Publicity officer informed the meeting that he was standing down as PRO and will be replaced, subject to the members' approval, by David Johnson 313th entry. He then introduced David to the members present. He had continued to place adverts for the Association in free Service related publications. He told members to read the next Daily Telegraph as our Reunion report would, hopefully, be in it.

f. Almoner

The Almoner stated that he had sent get well cards to fourteen members, Honorary members and member's wives. Six thinking of you cards had been sent to Association members suffering particularly difficult times in their lives as recognition that they are not alone and their fellow Association members were remembering them in their thoughts". These were the only ones notified to him, but he is sure that there are other members out there who have been ill or who have experienced difficult times during the year. However, if the information was not notified to either him, or a fellow committee member, he could not react. He asked that, if you do hear of any occasion where you feel a card should be sent, please do get in touch. His contact details, as well as those for all the other Committee members, are on the Association Website. The Chairman had mentioned that the future of the Association rested with attracting new members especially from the 300 series entrants. As Almoner he normally had to report on the death of members but he wanted to say that this year he had managed to recruit one fellow 318th Entry member.

g. Golf Secretary

The Golf Secretary presented trophies to Harry Trumbell and Ian Thomson, the winners of the Friday matches,

h. Archivist

The Archivist had little to report as there haven't been very many additions to the archives. The only thing outstanding is the work on the Toblerone, at the RAF Museum, which has been put on hold with the appointment of a new Director. He is working on a presentation using records of a 33rd Entry apprentice showing correspondence from the Air Ministry, letters from the School and various certificates of achievement together with extracts from a handwritten diary and pass-out results. He has these on record so that when the presentation is needed it will not take long to produce.

j. <u>Website Manager</u>

The Website Manager reported that the site averaged 4,000 hits per month between January and June 2013. He updates every two weeks, depending on need. Some problems with "spammers" on the Application Form and Find a Friend; but reluctant to report as spam because applications from genuine users could be lost. There have been no problems with publishing since using second computer with Windows XP. He will shortly be revisiting the Bircham Newton pages to separate out material relating to the Heritage Centre. The Yahoo Site builder is outdated but the work and cost of re-launching the site is, in his opinion, not worth the effort. He reiterated the fact that the Website is not in competition with the Newsletter. He again asked that Regional Group reports, forthcoming events such as reunions or anything else that needs to get to the membership should be copied to both him and Peter Ralph (Newsletter). (After the meeting Alan gave a presentation, which had to be produced in haste due to a computer burn out. The presentation was very well received).

ITEM 8 Hendon Museum Project progress report.

Toblerone - The Chairman had recently been in contact with Matt George, Head of design at the RAF Museum, who advised that the RAF Museum's Director General, Peter Dye, had removed the Halton Apprentice display which had been at the Museum for many years and consequently Matt was now uncertain whether our toblerone display would be feasible. He is in regular contact with Matt who is very keen for our toblerone display to be in place and has agreed to contact Bryan in a few months time as the Museum staff are concentrating on next year's 100th Anniversary of the start of WW1 and also the Dornier display. Once these are complete Bryan has been told that a planning meeting will be held to discuss all future Museum displays.

Albums - The Chairman advised that he has now received the lists of ex-apprentices in the 8-million series of numbers from DCOS Cranwell. He was very surprised to discover that some 600 numbers in the series were never actually allocated to anyone. DCOS confirmed the fact and advised that these numbers were probably allocated by PMC to applicants who later changed their mind about joining or failed to arrive at Hereford. Details have now been passed to the Website Manager of complete lists, by Entry, of every Admin Apprentice and Alan will update the existing lists on the Website. The Chairman will also furnish the Publicity Officer with the same information and these lists will then be incorporated into the albums along with Entry photographs. Due to the limitations of the Data Protection Act, the information contained in the revised Entry Lists will be number, surname, Christian name where known and initials.

ITEM 9 Administrative Apprentice Memorial at the National Memorial Arboretum

The Administrative Apprentice memorial commemorating all who trained as Administrative Apprentices and Apprentice Clerks between 1925 and 1973 has now been in place at the National Memorial Arboretum; Alrewas for a little over one year and the dedication ceremony took place on 20th October last year. If anyone would like a copy of the Dedication Service the leaflets are available from the Chairman. He hopes some members may have had the opportunity to visit the NMA over the last year and that they are as pleased as he is with the memorial.

ITEM 10 Resolutions.

The Committee had not received any resolutions from the members.

ITEM 11 Election of Association Committee for 2013/14

The Chairman stated that all the Committee appointments are scheduled to be elected/re-elected at this AGM. Appointments are for one year, with the exception of those of the Secretary and Treasurer and both these are for 3 years. However, we will not vote on the election of an Association Secretary today. As you may know Bob Wise, the current Association Secretary, is experiencing significant family health problems and we have therefore agreed that he will hand over the responsibilities of Association Secretary as soon as possible; personally, though he is very pleased to say that Bob has agreed to be considered for election to the Vice-Chairman appointment. A member of the 314th Entry, Ed Reilly has volunteered to take on the role of Association Secretary, but unfortunately Ed is unable to attend this AGM because of a long standing family commitment. However, Ed will join us at the next Committee meeting in October when he will become Secretary (designate) and then available for election at next year's AGM. Therefore, Bob has agreed to remain in the Secretary post until the October meeting.

Bob Danes today stands down as Publicity Officer. Since taking on the task Bob has worked hard to promote the Association through whatever media outlets he has been able to persuade to place an advert at a minimal cost, including national and local newspapers, military publications and military affiliated museums. He, along with Alan Bell, was also instrumental in the early stages of the Hendon Toblerone project and then continued to collate the necessary information for the creation of the albums to be placed at the RAF Museum. The Chairman, and he is sure, the members of the Committee will miss Bob's support, timely advice and humour. and a vote of thanks was recorded to Bob for all he has done for our Association. A member of the 313th Entry, David Johnson, who was in attendance, has volunteered to stand for election to the Publicity Officer role. Therefore, to meet the requirements of the Articles of Association, nominees and seconders for the appointments of four Committee members was requested:-

Over the last few years the Committee has received a great deal of help in tracing former Admin Apprentices from Bill Hoggarth. He has spent many hours tracking down names and addresses from Electoral Rolls and whatever available other source of information he could use. On behalf of the Association, and the Committee in particular, the Chairman recorded a vote of thanks to Bill for his support and dedication: Long may it continue.

ITEM 12 Cenotaph Remembrance Parade.

The Chairman stated that we were represented by 6 of our members at last year's Remembrance Day Parade at the Cenotaph. We will be requesting tickets at next month's Federation meeting for this year's allocation. Six members put their names forward and we will request 8 tickets.

ITEM 13 Any other business.

To celebrate the 75th Anniversary of RAF St Athan a Veterans Day will be held there on 9 July and all former Admin Apprentices are invited to attend.

In an attempt to cut down the long distance travelled by many members to Reunions, venues for future Reunions were discussed. After much debate the Chairman agreed to carry out a survey of distances travelled by members to the last few Reunions and report his finding to the next AGM when the subject would be discussed further.

ITEM 14 Date and Venue of next AGM

The 2014 AGM and Reunion will be held at the Peterborough Marriott Hotel over the weekend of 13/14/15 June 2014

The Chairman closed the 16th Annual General Meeting of the Royal Air Force Administrative Apprentices Association at 1530 pm.
